The Process:

The process of getting porcelain veneers typically involves a few visits to our dental office.

- **Consultation:** During the initial consultation, we will examine your teeth to determine if porcelain veneers are the right option for you. We may take X-rays or make impressions of your mouth and teeth.



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- **Preparation:** To prepare for a veneer, we will reshape the tooth surface, which is an amount nearly equal to the thickness of the veneer. After the tooth is prepared, your we will make a model or impression of your tooth.
- **Bonding:** Before permanently cementing the veneer to your tooth, we will temporarily place it to examine its fit and color. The veneer color can be adjusted with the shade of cement used. Once the color is determined, and the veneer is ready to be applied, the tooth will be cleaned, polished, and etched to allow for a strong bonding process.

Aftercare:
